4. Compute the product

5. Compute the product

$$\prod_{n=1}^{\infty} (1+x^{2^n}).$$

6. Find a formula for the general term of the sequence

 $1, 2, 2, 3, 3, 3, 4, 4, 4, 4, 5, 5, 5, 5, 5, \ldots$

7. Define the sequence a_0, a_1, a_2, \ldots by $a_0 = 0, a_1 = 1, a_2 = 2, a_3 = 6$, and

, for $n \ge 0$.

Show that n divides a_n for every $n \ge 1$.
